Also I'm part of the Citizens Police Academy and I had the opportunity to go with our citizens to Elk Grove to see their facility and use their equipment for one of our classes and Chief Nowacki, I want you to know that they took us to the spot where Chief Nowacki parked his car. MEETING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC FOR 20 MINUTES:

Mayor Prejna: The first signatory is Jim Perry from 500 North Michigan Avenue from Lamar.

Jim Perry: Staff had mentioned that they gave all of you a copy of my PowerPoint and I just wanted to mention Nicholas Kim, the owner, and I am here to answer any questions. Thank you.

Mayor Prejna: Thank you for stepping forward. The next person on the signatory list is Patty Callahan. Good evening and thank you for coming forward.

Patty Callahan: Good evening Mayor and Council. I just noticed on our Consent for Ordinances that there's an approved application for an A2 liquor license for Rep's Place, Sports, Burgers & Beers location at 3200. People do want to come to the downtown. Just wanted to mention that, but anyways. I read in the Daily Herald that there was a short article about Mr. D'Astice and the Committee-of-the-Whole last week that bought up a, I don't know what you want to call it, an idea that we go ahead and as a City start offering tax incentives to bring in restaurants into the City. My question is where was this idea when we had a structure over at the Dominick's building and we were trying to work with Mr. Fritz Duda on that property there and where was this idea of having a tax incentive back then and trying to bring things into the City as restaurants and that. When we go ahead and if Ryan Homes is accepted we're going to be left with two ¾ acre lots and that's not a lot of room for tax incentives to bring restaurants in. Thank you for your focus. I really appreciate that. And I truly believe that if we go ahead and if we leave more space there they will come. And if we're offering tax incentives, that's a great idea. It really is. But not when we've got 100, what is it, 12 homes on the table right now? Maybe if we offer this and we kind of wait and see because where we're going to have two lots out there in the front that are ¾ of an acre first, and then there's a pond behind there that has how much space and then we're going to have these homes. Retail offers us more tax incentives. It's more than property tax dollars and it offers a sales revenue. And it also gives people jobs. Please consider this as its still on the back burner. I'm asking you please and I know Mr. D'Astice, who brought this up, I know that back in the Committee-of-the-Whole back on September 19th, I know that you've been for it since then. You made a comment that you had been out to the Des Plaines sight of Ryan Homes and that you had looked at them and that you'd even live in one of the homes that they were building. But we don't need more homes. This is our downtown and I think, yes, a tax incentive to bring more restaurants in is a great idea. But let's not continue to build 62 and Golf Road. That's not our downtown. That's not the heart of Rolling Meadows. Kirchoff and Meadow is. Thank you very much.

Mayor Prejna: Thank you for coming forward.

Mayor Prejna read the background on the four resolutions.

Mayor Prejna: Again, the question is shall all four resolutions be adopted. Will the Clerk please call the roll?

G) Resolution No. 18-R-26 / Award Contract for Construction Engineering Services for 2018 Street Resurfacing Program

Mayor Prejna read the background on the resolution.

Mayor Prejna: Is there a motion to adopt the resolution? Alderman Banger has made the motion and it has been seconded by Alderman D'Astice. Mr. D'Astice you have first bite at the apple. You seconded and you have the first bite of the apple.

Alderman D'Astice: Thank you. So I have a few questions on this I guess. I'm not sure. Did Christopher Burke Engineering, was this an open bid or did we just give it to them? It's \$57,000.

Mr. Vogt: For many years it's been part of the standard expectation and requirements of the City Engineer to perform these services.

Alderman D'Astice: So these are no bid contracts that we give out to Burke Engineering?

Mr. Vogt: It's a negotiated contract between the City staff and ourselves with needing to follow IDOT regulations with regards to the prices because it's almost always MFT work in full or in part.

Alderman D'Astice: Okay, and then the \$9,000 is that part of the \$100,000?

Mr. Vogt: No, we contract separately for our soil testing and that would be a separate purchase order with the soil testing.

Alderman D'Astice: Okay, so the \$100,000 is in the budget so I'd like to, I move to amend this motion to put the \$43,000, what's ever left over from the \$100,000, into the, to be used as a Road Fund.

Mayor Prejna: Okay, Mr. Vogt, go ahead Mr. Vogt.

Mr. Vogt: If I could, Mayor. What typically is done is the \$100,000 that is in the budget covers both the construction engineering for one program and then the design engineering for the next year's program. What we would typically expect to see come September or October once we get to a certain

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point in planning the 2019 budget is to look to have the civil engineering design and all the field measurements, accounting and the like for next year's potential programs part of that remaining \$43,000. That's typically how it works so it's already in the Road Program.

Mayor Prejna: So this is part of the budget process for....

Mr. Vogt: Its part of the typical budget process. It would need to be affirmed by the City Council next fall when we start to plan the 2019 Street Program.

Mayor Prejna: Okay

Alderman D'Astice: There's a motion on the table.

Alderman Veenbaas: I'll second the motion, but I'd like to make a comment.

Mayor Prejna: Yes, Mr. Veenbaas

Alderman Veenbaas: So let me understand this. So this \$43,000, right, thereabouts?

Alderman D'Astice: Yeah, thereabouts, \$43,000

Alderman Veenbaas: And Mr. Vogt you're saying that that amount of money will be leftover for next year's Road.

Mr. Vogt: Typically what's done is it would be expended or committed to in 2018 at the end of the year should the council, as we typically have done in recent years in September or no later than October, approve a preliminary working list for the Street Program and authorize the City Engineer to start working with Public Work's Staff on the planning for those streets. That's how we are able to have a contract already in place that you just approved by doing that work in the fall rather than waiting until the following spring of the budget year.

Alderman Veenbaas: I understand that part, but I'd like to clarify something. Mr. D'Astice, you're asking to earmark that money for the roads, correct? Are you saying the same thing?

Mr. Vogt: I think I'm hearing the same thing and that it's in the Road Fund to be used for road construction or road engineering unless I'm misunderstanding.

Alderman Veenbaas: My understanding here as I'm listening is we'd like the \$43,000 earmarked for the Road Fund for sure, however that's done through a motion or through intention or what?

Mayor Prejna: I know we have a motion on the table.

Mr. Krumstok: Can I just ask for clarification?

Mayor Prejna: I'd like to get this cleared before we....

Alderman Veenbaas: Thank you, and that's just my clarification. Thank you Mr. Mayor.

Mr. Krumstok: So can I just ask for clarification because now I'm a little confused. So are you trying to say that you want an extra \$43,000 to go to street repaving or building, or do you want as we're saying

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that money is already in the Local Road Fund for engineering to be done, released if you want to consider it, for the 2019 project, so I'm just asking for clarification? Again, are you asking for that \$43,000 to be put into additional roads?

Alderman D'Astice: Right, my motion was to take the \$43,000 and put it towards additional roads because I was not aware that we were going to use the remaining money, this \$43,000 or some part of it, for additional engineering.

Mr. Krumstok: For preparing for 2019.

Alderman D'Astice: Okay, is that in the budget like this or is it just....

Mr. Krumstok: It says \$100,000 for engineering on roads.

Alderman D'Astice: Okay. I think we need to be more clear moving forward. It wasn't in there. It just says for roads and the resolution says we're only going to use \$57,000. It doesn't say anything about using the other \$43,000 and if that's what the intent is, then that should probably be in here and communicated to us as well.

Mr. Krumstok: And we will put that in future and....

Mr. Vogt: We can do that in the resolutions. We can also what I would suggest, I'd consider doing that in the budget just to make it more clear that its part for one fiscal year and part for the other.

Mayor Prejna: Mr. Veenbaas

Alderman Veenbaas: I'm fine with that.

Alderman D'Astice: So that being the case, then I will withdraw my motion to amend if the second will withdraw the second.

Mayor Prejna: Okay. Mr. Cannon

Alderman Cannon: Thank you Mr. Mayor. I just wanted to go along with what we're talking about here. Just to remind everybody we've been doing this now for about 3 years where we pre-engineer for the next set of streets. I agree that the write-up doesn't really tell you that though, so but a question I have about it is I was a little bit confused. Is the \$9,000 for soil work for this year or is that for 2019?

Mr. Vogt: It's for 2018.

Alderman Cannon: I thought they did that work last year for this year.

Mr. Vogt: Not once....

Alderman Cannon: They did that before.

Mr. Vogt: We do it both in advance where needed and particularly for reconstructions. We do it for resurfacing to test the material that the contractor brings in. If we have some areas that need to excavate or full depth patch we reserve the right to have the soil people take a look at that. They're there in a consultant role.

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Alderman Cannon: So that's actual construction soil work then, not pre-work.

Mr. Vogt: The work that's referred to in the report tonight is for work during construction. We will have another proposal probably for several thousand dollars in the fall with the engineering services at that time, depending on what streets we decide to work on and what the extent of soil testing needs would be. It varies every year.

Alderman Cannon: Okay, and I guess to go along with what Mr. D'Astice said at the beginning, one of his original thoughts, I think, I'm not speaking for him, I'm speaking for myself, but I guess in the future I would just like to see that we would get other engineering companies to look at this process to see what their cost structure may be. Obviously I'm fine with this right now, but I think Burke's had this every year and it's really in a way a no bid contract and I would just like to see us a little competition for our dollars because we need to get every dollar we can in the actual construction so just a thought for the future. Thank you.

Mayor Prejna: We got lost in discussion, do you have a second that you wish to....

Alderman Veenbaas: Yes, Mr. Mayor I'd like to remove my second with the stipulation that we're going to, in the future, line item this out as we discussed already.

Mayor Prejna: Okay, thank you. Any further discussion? Will the Clerk please call the roll?

Mayor Prejna read the background on the resolution.

Mayor Prejna: Is there a motion to adopt the resolution?

Alderman D'Astice: So moved Mr. Mayor

Mayor Prejna: Thank you and it's been seconded. Mr. D'Astice you brought it up, you're first.

Alderman D'Astice: Thank you sir. Yeah, my question here, like the other one, is it's a \$148,000 bid and it seems to me that it's been a no bid contract. I understand this company has worked with us in the past and they have a good reputation and they have good work. I understand all of that, but I don't understand why we do not do RFP's. It's been my experience that as good and as healthy and as strong and great that these people may be, when they know there's competition everyone sharpens their pencil a little bit. I will not vote for this because its not been put out to bid and moving forward I'm putting staff on notice if we're not going to go out to bid I'm going to start voting no on all these things. We need to go out to bid so we can get as much money, we can get the biggest bang for our buck and that's all there is to it.

3) Staff Traffic Advisory Report – March 2018

Mr. Vogt: The monthly meeting of the Traffic Review Committee was held on Wednesday, March 7, 2018. Information is provided on the following discussion topics for the Mayor and City Council:

1. Brockway Street/Old Plum Grove Road crosswalk request. The requested installation appears to not be justified, based on observations. Public Works Staff will contact the School District for any other information and will then contact the requester.
2. Squibb/Ring/Apollo area roadways. The next traffic counts will be scheduled for collection in May, 2018.
3. Meadowbrook Industrial Court parking problem. It was reported that some citations were issued and the problem appears to have been remedied.
4. Kieth Court parking problem with existing prohibition and sign locations. A resident from Kieth Court attending this Traffic Review Committee meeting and spoke to the problems experienced; a solution was offered to basically change the parking restrictions. A resident survey will be mailed, and if neighborhood concurrence is reached, an ordinance will be drafted for consideration.
5. Dupont Avenue at Vermont Street. The Planning and Zoning Commission meeting, held March 6, 2018, had heard resident concerns about parked cars, speeding, and hazards associated with the 90-degree intersection. A four-lot single family subdivision is proposed on the north side of Dupont Avenue. Staff offered to have the Traffic Review Committee review these issues again, upon installation of proposed public improvements by the developer.

6. Arbor Drive curve, south of the apartment complex offices. This location has previously been discussed by the Traffic Review Committee; a guardrail has often been requested. However, there is not enough right-of-way available to install a guardrail. The City Engineer was asked to evaluate an elevation change to the Arbor Drive profile, upon future street resurfacing, to improve the situation.

The next meeting of the Traffic Review Committee is scheduled for Wednesday, April 4, 2018.

MATTERS NOT ON THE AGENDA:

Mayor Prejna: The one item that I have is we had the discussion with council last fall about doing a traffic count with Kirchoff Road so, Mr. Krumstok.

Mr. Krumstok: We actually attempted to do that. Then we had the weather that was not conducive to it. We did finish part of it and as we told the Economic Development Committee recently we are going to do it now that Comets is also open. So we're trying to compare our updates, but we will have those numbers hopefully pretty soon, but we again mentioned that at the Economic Development Committee and we want to make sure that Comets was open and flowing so hopefully our numbers will be better.

Mayor Prejna: Thank you. Are there any other Matters Not on the Agenda? Mr. D'Astice

Alderman D'Astice: Thank you. Yes, I would like to ask staff, and it could be Martha, I'm not sure for the May Economic Development Committee could you possibly, or could staff possibly, provide the Committee a list of vacancies and commercial open land throughout the City so that we can, the Economic Development Committee, can start to brainstorm and come up with ideas on how we can possibly market these vacancies and commercial open land. Now that we have, after so many months, flushed out the restaurant incentive I'd like to take us on to the next project of trying to fill vacancies and commercial open land throughout the City. Since our next meeting is not until May that will give us enough time.

Mr. Krumstok: We'll put that on our list.

Mayor Prejna: Thank you. Any other Matters Not on the Agenda? Mr. Cannon

Alderman Cannon: Thank you Mr. Mayor. Tonight we approved crack sealing for streets and I guess I would like to ask staff a rhetorical question at this point. Why don't we include bike paths and I'd like to see bike paths included soon. In our area there's a partial bike path on Quentin where there are cracks that are literally an inch, and inch and a half wide, that go all the way across the bike path and have never been touched by us. So I guess I would like to see us include bike paths that we own to get that work done also.

Mayor Prejna: Thank you. You can give us a Staff Report.

Mr. Vogt: We can follow up with that.

Alderman Cannon: I don't necessarily need a report. I would like to get it included.

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Mr. Vogt: We do inspect the bike paths every year and I'll certainly take note of that in terms of the condition assessment and act accordingly.

Alderman Cannon: Thank you.

Mayor Prejna: Any other items?
