Candidates appearing on this year's ballot are:


- Nick Budmats (Ward 2) – four-year term

CITY WELCOMES 67 NEW BUSINESSES IN 2024

Rolling Meadows' reputation as a great place to do business was further cemented in 2024, with 67 new companies opening shop in our community. In the last three years alone, the City has welcomed nearly 200 new businesses in a variety of fields, and expanded local restaurant and retail options for residents.

Expanded Shopping & Dining

"Attracting new businesses to our City helps improve residents' quality of life by expanding local options for shopping, dining, and entertainment," Business Development Manager Martha Corner explained.

"It also helps diversify the local tax base, which reduces reliance on property taxes to fund essential services," she added.

Prioritize Business Development

Rolling Meadows' business development and retention program is designed to promote success. The City possesses a wide variety of resources and information – from

vacant property listings to an updated Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Code – to help business owners and their representatives make sound decisions that support their specific goals. City staff members are also equipped with information to help companies succeed.

ASK PUBLIC WORKS: WINTER STORM EDITION

Q. How does Public Works prepare for winter storms?

A. Crews have been conducting annual training, inspecting snow fighting equipment, installing plows on the City’s fleet of snow removal trucks, and conducting “dry runs” on their designated routes since last fall. This advance preparation ensures their readiness to completely clear the streets of ice and snow – and help residents travel safely – whenever and wherever snow arrives.

Q. What streets get plowed first? Why?

A. Snowplow drivers cover eight designated routes across Rolling Meadows. Crews tackle primary roads, such as Kirchoff Road and Rohlwing Road, first. This helps guarantee open roads for emergency vehicles to reach locations throughout the City and surrounding areas. Once these routes are open, plows begin to clear residential streets on their assigned

routes. Other streets, such as Golf and Algonquin Roads, and Euclid Avenue, are plowed by the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) or the Cook County Highway Department.

Q. Can residents shovel or blow snow into the street and let the plows remove it when they come?

A. Short answer: No. Blowing snow into streets can cause icy hazards for motorists. Also, the snow you’ve shoveled into the street is likely to land back on your driveway when plows return.

Q. How can I prevent plows from pushing snow onto the driveway after I’ve already cleared it?

A. Shovel snow to the right side of the driveway (while facing the street) whenever possible. This will limit the amount of snow that is pushed onto the driveway by passing plows.

FIRE DEPARTMENT HOSTS MONTHLY CPR/AED/BLS CERTIFICATION CLASSES

Monthly courses offered by the Rolling Meadows Fire Department offer community members the opportunity to earn Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), Automated External Defibrillator (AED), and Healthcare Professional Basic Life Support (BLS) certification.

Classes take place at Station 16 (2340 Hicks Road), 6–9pm, on the third Wednesday of each month, except December.

Upon course completion, participants will be certified for two years.



Registration is \$40 per person. Monthly classes are limited to 10 participants. Group training is also available.
