

Ordinance No. 11-32

**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF PERSONAL PROPERTY
OWNED BY THE CITY OF ROLLING MEADOWS**

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 10 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, and 5 ILCS 220/1-8 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes authorize and encourage intergovernmental cooperation; and

WHEREAS, the Northwest Municipal Conference, a corporate organization representing municipalities and townships chartered within the State of Illinois and Counties of Cook, Lake and DuPage organizes joint municipal auctions of surplus vehicles; and

WHEREAS, in the opinion of a majority of the Corporate Authorities of the City of Rolling Meadows, it is no longer necessary, useful, or in the best interest of said jurisdiction to retain ownership of the property hereinafter described.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Rolling Meadows, Illinois as follows:

SECTION ONE: Pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, the City Council finds that the following described property now owned by the City of Rolling Meadows is no longer necessary or useful or in the best interest of the City to maintain and the City would be best served by the sale of the property:

SECTION TWO: The City Manager is hereby authorized to direct the sale of the remaining aforementioned personal property at a Northwest Municipal Conference sponsored on-line or live auction service, or by other means.

SECTION THREE: The City Manager is hereby authorized to direct the Northwest Municipal Conference to advertise the sale of the aforementioned property through the area newspapers, direct mailings and other channels deemed appropriate prior to the date of said auction.

SECTION FOUR: The City Manager is authorized to direct Northwest Municipal Conference to enter into an agreement for the sale of said property whereby said property is sold at the auction.

SECTION FIVE: No bid shall be accepted for the sale of an item which is less than the minimum value set forth herein, unless the City Manager of their designee so authorizes at the time of the auction.

SECTION SIX: Upon payment in full of the auctioned price for aforesaid items of property by the highest bidder, the City Manager is authorized to direct the Northwest Municipal Conference to convey and transfer the title and ownership of said property to the bidder.

SECTION SEVEN: In the event any item is not sold at such public auction, the City Manager is further authorized and directed to dispose of such items by private sale or auction at such price to be determined by the City Manager.


SECTION EIGHT: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, by a vote of at least three-fourths (3/4ths) of the corporate authorities, and approval and publication in the manner provided by law.


